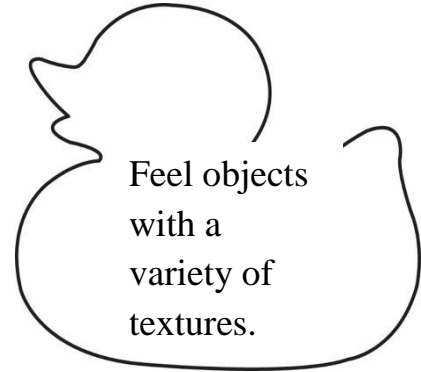
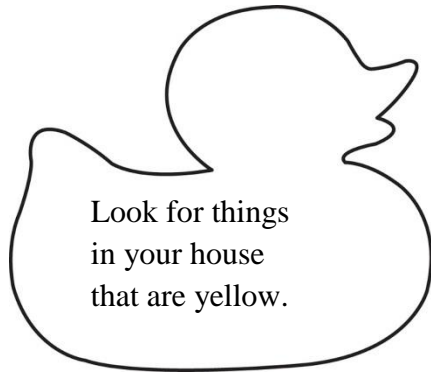
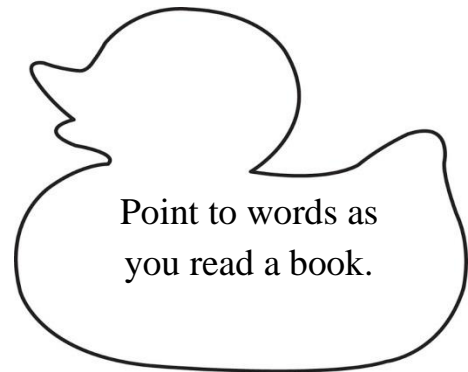


Rubber Ducky Club: June 2020

Instructions:

What is Early Literacy?

Early literacy begins at birth. It is the development of skills that a child needs to eventually learn to read and write. The six practices of Early Literacy are:

Vocabulary: The more words children know, the more easily they will be able to begin decoding print once they begin to read.

Print Motivation: A child's interest in books and learning to read.

Print Awareness: A basic understanding of how text works.

Narrative Skills: The ability to tell a story.

Letter Knowledge: Learning that letters are different from each other, and that each letter has its' own unique associated sounds.

Phonological Awareness: The ability to hear that words are comprised of small but repeating sounds -larger than letters, but smaller than actual words- and to manipulate these sounds.
